


## COLOR YOUR GARDEN WITH PERENNIALS BY JOHN OTTERSON

Summer is the perfect time to enjoy the colors, shapes, textures and creatures in your landscape. If you ran out of time and didn't plant your annuals or perennials in the spring, consider this: for instant color, add a Purple Coneflower, Shasta Daisy and Black-eyed Susan. They're all readily available in quart or gallon containers. Choose a spot that's visible from your porch or patio and plant one of each of these flowers about 12 inches apart, in the shape of a triangle. You'll have an instant perennial garden for the remainder of the summer.

For more color, fill a container—anything from a galvanized pot to concrete urn—with annuals, ornamental grasses or vines. If all this sounds like too much work, visit the entrance to the LGH Health Campus along the Harrisburg Pike. Tomlinson Bomberger is developing a perennial garden for masses of summer color.

Sit back and watch your garden grow.



## ABUNDANT RAINS MAKE WEEDS A PAIN BY BOB KANDRATAVICH

- Q: Why do I have weeds even though my lawn was treated in the spring?
- A: Abundant spring and early summer moisture provided ideal growing conditions for weeds. There are numerous types of broadleaf weeds that had not germinated when we treated in the spring. Therefore, they require a summer treatment to control them.

Some summer weeds are annuals—they grow for one year and then die. Others are perennial weeds, like yellow nutsedge, which appear each year in the late spring and early summer. When soil-moisture levels are high, these weeds flourish in your lawn.

- Q: How do I get rid of summer weeds?
- A: Under normal conditions, two spray treatments for weed control (spring and fall) will manage weeds in your lawn. However, during summers with high moisture levels, as in 2003 and 2004, an additional summer weed treatment is needed to manage weeds. Some weeds, like yellow nutsedge, require treatment with a specific material different than what we typically use on broadleaf weeds.

Another Summer Pain: Grubs. Wet summers provide ideal conditions for white grub activity to continue. Grubs feed voraciously on the roots of your lawn, creating brown areas. An application of preventive grub control will prevent turf damage by these pests.
